Hertfordshire Partnership NHS Foundation Trust is the Fifth mental health trust to be rated "outstanding" by the Care Quality Commission.

Tom will talk in detail about how they set about to achieve this rating, the challenges they faced, the values they set and how they continue to deliver high quality care and great outcomes.

Tom will also talk about how he was recognised for his leadership and how he has been named in the HSJ Top 50 Chief Executives in recent years and in 2017 he received the prestigious HSJ Chief Executive of the Year Award.
