A year after the publication of the NHS long term plan, our fifth annual Integration Summit, which is being held in partnership with Local Government Association will focus on integrated care systems and the progress towards national coverage by April 2021. **11:10 Shared data, a key foundation for integrated working**

During this session Nigel will draw on the experience of the Frimley ICS and Berkshire West ICS “Connected Care” project and the progress they have made at sharing clinical data across the patch, including local authorities. Covering both direct care and for the broader analytical and population health insights. Nigel will talk about the project and the challenges they have faced.

**12:20 A Practical approach to creating Integrated Care Provider partnerships in Place**

This presentation will practically consider how providers should work together to develop partnership working in Place, and how that fits into an ICS approach to health and social care delivery. It will look at the key issues which need to be addressed, such as - sharing money, who does what, risk share options, information flows, audit, patient safety and regulation, as well as what legal structures can be used to govern integrated working. Gerard provides specialist public law input, especially on NHS commissioning and provider functions and powers. **14:20 Lessons from the experience of integrated care systems in implementing the long term plan**

**Professor Sir Chris Ham**, Independent chair, Coventry and Warwickshire Health and Care Partnership

This session will focus on the work of integrated care systems (ICSs) and how they are beginning to transform the delivery of health and care across England. Chris Ham will draw on his work at The King’s Fund in working with several systems around the country and the experience of the Coventry and Warwickshire Health and Care Partnership where he has been the independent chair since January 2019. He will cover leadership and governance in ICSs, relationships within the NHS and between the NHS and local government, the changing role of the regulators, and new ways of contracting for and funding NHS services, such as aligned incentive contracts.

Susannah will talk about the journey in Suffolk and North East Essex from its early beginnings as one of the original STPs to becoming an ICS.
