It has become ever clearer over the year since the first highly successful HFMA / CIPFA Summit that integration is at the heart of the health and social care agenda. Not only is there a requirement to prepare plans in 2017 for full integration by 2020, but Sustainability and Transformation Plans are predicated on understanding the whole health and social care system; the Better Care Fund's pooled budget initiatives have been extended; integration sits logically with the moves towards devolution; and the potential streamlining and improvement of care pathways is key to savings plans in both health and local government.
