Dr Mark Britnell, Global Chairman and Senior Partner at KPMG

Global healthcare leader and award-winning author, Mark Britnell draws on his work in 77 countries to offer solutions to this growing crisis and present unique insights into what works, and what does not. Reframing the global workforce challenge to one of health and national wealth, his forthcoming book 'Human: Solving the global workforce crisis in healthcare' invites us to refashion this wicked problem in new, adaptive ways in order to enhance productivity and prosperity. Harnessing technology, Mark asks us to imagine new models of care and levels of workforce agility, whilst always remembering that the kind heart of a human is the essence of care.

15:00 **Brexit: what will this mean for the NHS?**

Dr Layla McCay, Director of International Relations, NHS European Office & Member of the Brexit Health Alliance

Brexit has brought about a time of uncertainty for healthcare in the UK, particularly for the workforce that keeps it running. Many unanswered questions still remain, as government policies and strategies are still being ironed out. What impact will this have on patients and staff? What about innovation, supply chains and budgets? Will patients still have access to new medicines?

This session will address these fundamental questions in more detail, assessing some of the potential Brexit outcomes, and exploring the implications as the NHS prepares for life after Brexit.

Working on behalf of the NHS Confederation's European Office and as part of the Brexit Health Alliance, Layla will give CEOs the opportunity to provide feedback on what support and help trusts will need post-Brexit, as well as bringing CEOs bang up to date on one of the most topical challenges facing the NHS at the moment.
