## **Congratulations to HFMA's award winners**

East of England productivity and efficiency group and PrecsQIPP Community Interest Company are the winners of this year's inaugural HFMA Environmental Sustainability Award. Their inhaler carbon awareness campaign represents a single initiative over a large system-wide footprint, with the opportunity to be replicated nationwide.

The Newcastle upon Tyne Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust was highly commended for their groundbreaking program on measuring and reducing the carbon footprint of their supply chain. Also shortlisted, Manchester University NHS Foundation Trust has several projects and initiatives to deliver positive environmental and social impacts alongside financial savings, the 'triple bottom line'.

### In the news...

#### COP27

At the <u>United Nation's COP27 summit</u> in Egypt this November, a historic deal was struck to establish a loss and damage fund. In other areas there was disappointment, particularly over progress on cutting fossil fuels. **Earthshot prize** 

The Earthshot prize aims to discover and help scale innovative solutions that put the world firmly on a trajectory toward a stable climate by 2030. On 2 December 2022, Prince William revealed the 2022 winners: <u>Protect and Restore Nature</u>; <u>Clean our Air</u>, <u>Revive our Oceans</u>; <u>Build a Waste-free</u> World; and Fix our Climate.

#### Health and Care Act 2022 (the Act)

The Act embeds net zero into legislation, placing new requirements on all NHS trusts, foundation trusts, and integrated care boards and granting new statutory guidance powers to NHS England to support the fulfilment of these new duties. Find out more <u>here</u>.

## National reports and guidance

#### Emissions gap report 2022

The UN emissions gap report 2022, <u>The closing window – climate crisis</u> <u>calls for rapid transformation of societies</u> is the 13<sup>th</sup> edition in the annual series. The report finds that 'the international community is falling far short of the Paris goals, with no credible pathway to 1.5°C in place. Only an urgent system-wide transformation can avoid climate disaster.' The report explores how to deliver this transformation across electricity supplies, transport, buildings, food and financial systems.

#### The Lancet countdown on health and climate change

The <u>2022 report of the Lancet countdown on health and climate change</u> tracks the links between health and climate change – shining a light on the growing and profound threat to health presented by climate change and air pollution.

The latest evidence reaffirms that climate change is exacerbating food insecurity, health impacts from extreme heat, the risk of infectious disease outbreaks, and life-threatening extreme weather events. The authors indicate that a delay in the adoption of clean energies has left households vulnerable to energy poverty and exposed to dangerous levels of fuel-derived air pollution.

The report concludes that through the introduction of more resilient energy systems, there is a global opportunity to save at least 1.2 million lives from cleaner air and 11.5 million lives from healthier diets, while reducing energy poverty, and delivering healthier, more liveable cities.

#### NHS Scotland sustainability strategy

NHS Scotland has set out its <u>sustainability strategy</u> for the next five years, as part of the longer term goal of being a net-zero health service by 2040. The strategy sets out actions and targets in five areas: buildings and land; travel; goods and services; care; and communities.

With estimates that 80% of Scotland's global climate emissions are linked to the production, consumption and waste of products and resources, the strategy sets out plans to create a circular economy – extracting less from the planet and re-using more of what has already been taken. Proposed actions in the goods and services theme include: classifying suppliers based on climate change and circular supply systems; taking into account whole life costs when assessing tenders; and phasing out plastics that cause the most damage to the environment.

#### Green theatre initiative

The Royal College of Surgeons of England, The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow, and The Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, have declared their commitment to the <u>green theatre initiative</u> to protect patient health and wellbeing and tackle the environmental impact of surgical care. Resources include a <u>green theatre checklist poster</u> and <u>compendium of evidence</u>.

#### National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) guidance on inhalers

<u>NICE patient decision aid</u> provides information for patients to enable informed decisions about their choice of inhaler in relation to its contribution to climate change and aid discussions with healthcare professionals

#### Estates net zero carbon delivery plan

The <u>Estates net zero carbon delivery plan</u> and <u>Technical annex</u> are both available on the <u>Greener</u> <u>NHS Knowledge Hub</u>. The plan includes a four step approach to decarbonise the NHS estate and references a range of actions to tackle climate change in other areas such as driving forward a circular economy; the electrification of the NHS fleet; engaging the supply chain; preparing the estate for severe weather; and committing to active travel.

## Training

#### Environmentally sustainable healthcare programme

This environmentally sustainable healthcare e-learning programme was developed with the Centre for Sustainable Healthcare and the Health Education England Northeast Faculty of Sustainable Healthcare. It aims to provide the healthcare workforce with the knowledge and skills to deliver healthcare for financial, social and environmental sustainability. The new training module, *Building a net zero NHS*, available here and free to undertake, has been endorsed by Greener NHS.

#### **Carbon Literacy project**

The Carbon Literacy project launched a single day leadership module this year. The training content has been quality assured and approved by the Greener NHS programme and is appropriate for those at any leadership level/specialty. Contact Carbon Literacy to discuss delivery costs and options.

#### **ICAEW** sustainability certificate

The <u>ICAEW sustainability certificate</u> aims to equip accountants and other finance professionals with the practical knowledge and skills to integrate sustainability reporting into their organisations. The certificate supports finance professionals to confidently partner with sustainability experts to identify climate-related risks and incorporate performance and financial metrics into their risk management, financial planning and analysis, and environmental, social and governance (ESG) reporting.

#### ACCA certificate in sustainability for finance

The ACCA has a <u>Certificate in sustainability for finance</u>, recognising that finance professionals have an important part to play in helping organisations adapt to the sustainable practices required to prevent resource depletion, facilitating long term success, and building a more sustainable future.

#### Environmental, social and governance (ESG) courses

AICPA and CIMA have launched a new certificate, *Fundamentals of ESG certificate*, to help accounting and finance professionals embrace ESG. From January 2023, CIMA is running a half day programme, *ESG - an awareness*, to provide an introductory understanding of key ESG issues.

#### The Centre for Sustainable Healthcare (CSH)

CSH works with NHS trusts to integrate sustainability into quality improvement. CSH has freely available resources, developed with support from Health Education England and The Health Foundation - *step-by-step project resources (at SusQl.org); educator pack (at SusQl.org); and a 30-minute introductory e-learning session (on <u>e-LfH</u>)* 

#### Greener NHS knowledge hub

The <u>Greener NHS knowledge hub</u> now includes a training hub that brings together a variety of training and educational offers at the intersection of climate and health. The aim is to ensure that there is training available for all, whatever your role and wherever you may be on your sustainability journey.
